Walsingham Day at Chichester Cathedral

In October, a special day of celebration took place at the cathedral in honour of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Bishop Martin warmly welcomed the Bishop of Burnley to celebrate the mass and processed with the statue of Mary in its ornate canopy down the completely full nave, to the altar. The side aisles also were full and although we had arrived in good time to see the impressive procession, we had to sit in a side aisle, watching the celebration on a large TV screen.

Chichester Diocese has always had a strong link with Walsingham, especially since the restoration of the shrine in 1931 and, in fact, every year sends the largest group in the country to the Youth Pilgrimage. Of course, nothing compares with going to Walsingham itself, but the day was truly impressive with its splendid ceremony, majestic organ playing, the air full of incense, the fervour of the hymns and the detailed and precise organisation.

Not only were we blessed with holy water from the well, but in a ladle we were able to drink the water and our hands were washed. This day of pilgrimage was painstaking in its organisation because we pilgrims were also give the opportunity to experience the laying on of hands and to be anointed if we wished.

I was struck by an overwhelming sense of the kindness of the priest who laid his hands on my head and I was blessed by his thanks to God and his supplication that I would receive strength and peace. What a gift for some one to exude kindness before even saying a word!

This Walsingham celebration, full of fervour, goes down as the most memorable celebratory mass that I have yet experienced – truly remarkable and representative of the Anglican Church at its very best.



The Worthing Branch of Gideons International was formed in 1950 –(the third branch after London& Portsmouth) –today in the UK there exists 250 Branches! We number 16 active members, but would welcome some additional men & women (professional or business backgrounds) to meet the increasing demands on our resources.

The general public associate Gideons with placing Bibles in Hotel bedrooms - however our scope is much wider. For example every year, we in Worthing place nearly 3000 New Testaments in the hands of 12 year-olds in some 15 local schools. Every month Worthing Hospital Wards are topped up with easy-toclean versions of the NT. Four times a year we are invited to Ford Prison to take the Evening Service when we are able to offer slimline copies of the NT. Visiting Residential Care Homes is a regular feature of our work providing Large Print Testaments for elderly folk who may well have sight restrictions. And of course topping up Hotels and B&Bs in our area is an ongoing task. Additionally we are always on the lookout for other opportunities to place copies of the Word of God – e.g. Doctor's/ Dentist's Surgeries; Cadet Forces; Cub Scouts & Girl Guides; College Students.....the list has no identifiable end! Finally to add to the statistics Gideon Branches operate in 200 Countries with nearly 300,000 Members. Every denomination in the Christian Church is represented and indeed we see ourselves as "an arm of the Church" who can reach places that churches cannot or would find difficult. Obviously we cannot function effectively without the prayerful support of Christians – so I do not hesitate to seek that support from church members in All Saints and St Peters..... if you could find a slot for a brief intercession? To that end you might consider becoming a *Friend of* the Gideons and receive our bi-annual newsletter which is filled with encouraging news and personal testimonies. I must stress we never advertise for funding – the Lord provides the means in amazing ways - we just get on with the job! 

More Fancy Dress

I don't suppose anyone noticed but I left one vestment out last month, so I thought I'd add it on now with one or two other more specialist bits of kit to make up the space.

I forgot the MANIPLE; it's a strip of coloured material about the same width as a stole but only about a foot long. It hangs over the priest's left wrist, and is always getting in the way when you try to do something. Originally it was literally a hand-kerchief and then a hand bag (latin manus = hand) and became a sort of portable pocket to keep things in. Some years ago it was discontinued. I really don't know who decides these things but that's why I left it out.

I could add in the COPE, a big cloak worn for processions and effect, not for convenience, but useful for recruiting very small servers as cope-bearers before they are old enough to be trusted with a candle.

Monks wear a habit, a cassock with a hood; and a scapula (latin = shoulder blade) a sort of back and front apron to keep the cassock clean; and a girdle - s rope round the middle which has 3 big KNOTS along it for the 3 vows of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience. I once heard a monk talking to a youth group describe the knots as the 3 FREEDOMS; FREE from family responsibility, FREE from money worries and FREE from wondering what I ought to do nest. It's a point of view.

Even more specialist kit, which you will only see on a BISHOP.

On his/her head a MITRE a pointed tall hat like a dunce's cap (don't follow that line of thought!).It's meant to signify the flames of fire on the apostles' heads at Pentecost (Acts ch2 v3)

In his/her HAND a CROOK which a shepherd uses to stop a sheep getting away or (the sharp end) to make it get a move on.

And on his/her finger a RING. It should be an AMETHYST (Greek a- not and methys= drunk <u>as in methylated spirits</u>, Acts ch 2 v15) but lots of bishops cheat on this nowadays and wear a signet ring instead.

Friends recently funded a secure stainless-steel handrail to improve the safety of access to this important site. The Cathedral is a popular destination for school children from around the diocese. Friends have helped make the Learning and Engagement centre an attractive and well-equipped place for schoolchildren and their teachers to meet and work.

And hot off the press, The Friends has just entered into an agreement to fund a Scholarship for a Cathedral Chorister for 5 years! Look out for the chorister proudly wearing the Friends medal!

Chichester Cathedral Friends is a registered charity. Membership costs £15 per year and £25 for a couple. For more information






